To clarify the scope of practice for nurses in an emergency, under SDCL 36-9-28 Practices not prohibited by chapter, the SD Board of Nursing supports that nursing care provided in an emergency is not restricted to the basic scope of practice identified in SDCL 36-9-3, 36-9-4, 36-9-4.1, and ARSD 20:48:04.
